Ann Ditty received her undergraduate degree from Missouri State University (Child Development) and a Master's Degree from Central Missouri State University (Sociology/Children Studies and Gerontology). Ann's wrote the "History of Child Care Regulation in Missouri " as her thesis for this Master's program. During Ann's 28 years working for the State of Missouri she was responsible for child abuse/neglect investigations, foster care placements/licensing, adoption services, and during her last twenty years held multiple positions with Missouri's child care licensing programs. Ann also served for several years as a Licensing Consultant for a Kansas City non-profit (LINC) that provided after-school child care programs for the Kansas City elementary schools.

Ann served in various positions on the NARA Board of Directors for fifteen years (including NARA's President from 2006 - 2011). Ann and Carolynne collaborated with others to create and develop the online licensing coursework and licensor credentialing programs in partnership with the University of Southern Maine/Muskie School of Public Policy. Ann also served as a member of the National Eco-Healthy Advisory Board and the National Pandemic Advisory Committee for the Center of Disease Control.

Since 2011, Ann has earned a Certificate of Ministry from the Austin Presbyterian Theology Seminary and has worked as a Chaplain for Saint Luke's Hospital and the Serenity Grief Center and currently serves as a Hospice Chaplain.
